From "The Nomenclature of Wayne: A History of Wayne County, PA" by Thomas J. Ham (originally published 1905-1907 in The Honesdale Citizen; compiled and reprinted from the files of The News Eagle by George J. Fluhr 1995)

"Among numerous other settlers in, or in the vicinity of Little York [Preston Township], was Omar A. Lakin, who secured, in February 1881, the establishment of a post office there, which was located at his house, and named Lakin in his honor. He was commissioned postmaster, but his daughter, Ada G. Lakin, had charge of the business.

"Jonas Lakin, father of Omar A. Lakin, was born in New Hampshire in 1765, and on attaining manhood became the husband of Prudence Parks, daughter of Josiah Parks. Josiah Parks was a marine in the British service, but after he retired from the sea and settled on the Delaware river, became a noted scout in the American ranks, and participated in more than a score of battles with the Indians and Tories. He was known later as a famous Delaware river steersman, his earliest experience in that then hazardous calling being about 1765, when he went to Philadelphia as foreman for Daniel Skinner on his second trip down the river with a raft of pine masts. This voyage secured for Mr. Skinner the title of Lord High Admiral of all the raftsmen of the Delaware, and for Mr. Parks the prefix of Boatswain, and for the balance of their days these pioneers in what proved to be one of Wayne county's most prominent industries were known as 'Admiral' Skinner and 'Bos'n' Parks.

Jonas Lakin was the founder of the town of Hancock, N. Y., died there in 1848. His wife lived to the extraordinary age of 108 years. Among their family of nine children was O. A. Lakin, mentioned above, who married Clarissa Wainwright, and, after several years residence in Hancock, located in Preston, this county, in 1844. He, like most enterprising early settlers, engaged largely in lumbering and cleared up a fine farm, upon which he resided until his death in 1890.

Miss Ada G. Lakin, mentioned in connection with the post office, the eldest child of O. A. Lakin, was born in Hancock in 1834. A lady of superior education, being a graduate of a college at Bryan, Ohio, she devoted her life mainly to teaching, acquired a fine reputation in that profession in Wayne, Lackawanna and adjoining counties."

1880— Emory is still with him, altho John (who may be John Isaac, couldn't find Isaac in 1850) there seems to be a relationship with the Martin family.

1860 ages are a bit off—probably another household member gave the information.

“”Nomenclature of Wayne,” a reprint of a series of articles by Thomas J. Ham, published in the Honesdale Citizen 1905-1907. The articles were compiled in 1995 by Pike County Historian George J. Fluhr and recently reissued by the Wayne County Historical Society with an index.

The series is constructed around area post offices and gives considerable history of the areas covered, but unfortunately it only mentions the first postmaster at Starlight, who was George Wainwright. The location of the post office was “a farm house about two miles from its present location, now known as the Clark Du Mond farm;” (thanks to Ann O’Hara, of Wayne Co, PA for this reference.)

From Honesdale Citizen, Thursday, May 17, 1888:

“”Geo. Wainwright died in Lake Como, on Sunday, of pneumonia, aged 72 years. He was for many years a resident of Buckingham townshi, where he persued the occupation of a farmer.”” (actual death date of 13 May 1888)

Charles and George Wainwright—are from NY.

In all likelihood, the families knew each other prior to Buckingham Twp. Rebecca states they are somehow related. (everyone in that area was—either by marriage or blood—or both—pretty much—I don't buy the ashamed of it bit.) The Wainwright crowd are known to be from Sullivan and Delaware Cos, Cocheton/Calicoon, Hancock. These are not only areas common to all these groups, they are easily accessible to one another, then, now.

These families pretty much stayed within themselves, their areas—it didn't appear she was from a group who had an itchy foot.

At abt 8, 1870, Minnie Elizabeth should show in someone's house. Even if both parents were DEAD—someone had to take care of her. Grandparents, aunt, big sister—whatever. Homes and orphanages are enumerated— she never turned up anywhere. No Minerva, M.E. nationwide. Or by Google, rootsweb, ancestry, etc.

Children male or female, by age—b. between 1861 and 1864—just to give room for error.

July 2004: Latest update for this is: Helen's mother, Minnie, was living in Burlington Flats in 1900, Hartwick in 1901..... both towns adjoining the Town of New Lisbon, with Hartwick being a major trading center in the area.
